LEWIS DEE HEADRICK has been a member of the American Legion for 48 years and is a paid-for-life member. He could possibly be the oldest active Legionnaire. He was born in Conasauga (Polk County), TN on October 14, 1927. He has two children, Lewis Headrick, Jr., who lives in Colorado and Mary Huddleston, who lives in Tennessee. Mary served in the Military, Civil Service and worked with IRS.

Headrick volunteered for the Draft (Benton, TN) for Military Service on February 7, 1946, Air Corps Branch. His basic training was at Ft. Bliss El Paso, Texas, and then he was sent to Camp Kilmer, NJ. He noted that some of the highlights of his tour were when he served in Germany and Austria during the Berlin Airlift. A family story told is that Headrick was scheduled to go to Vietnam about 1964. His daughter Mary went to Church with her grandmother (Lewis' mother) where they prayed that he would not be sent to Vietnam. When Headrick went back to get his papers, he was told he was needed in New Foundland to work on Radar instead of going to Vietnam. After returning to Tyn-dal Airforce Base, where he served 21 years total in service, he decided to retire on June 30, 1966.

Days are now spent enjoying country life in Cohutta, but Headrick still attends the American Legion Post 112 where he served for many years as Junior Vice Commander. He loves attending meetings. In earlier years, he was Commander of the Chatsworth American Legion Post 167 for four years and served as Georgia District Commander in 1983-84 NS 93-94.

Headrick is also a 44-year member of the Forty & Eight Club - La Société des Quarante Hommes et Huit Chevaux (The Society of Forty Men and Eight Horses), which is an independent, invitation-only, honor society of American veterans and service members. He is also a 52-year Mason and has lifetime memberships in the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) and he has been a member of the Elks Club for about 49 years.
